### Tuition is non-refundable.

Also, please note “Out-of-School Suspension” is not an option. If it becomes necessary for a student to be suspended, that student will be dismissed from the program, without tuition reimbursement, and with forfeiture of credit.

Note: Any student who has more than 2 absences from a course through any combination of lateness and absence, *for any reason*, will not receive credit or refund of tuition. Note that a *lateness of 10 or more minutes to a class is considered an absence and leaving early 10 minutes or more is considered an absence.*

### Conduct

In order to maintain a well-organized summer school program with minimal disruption of the educational setting, students must be attentive to the rules and regulations and to disciplinary actions the administration will take when a disruption occurs. Incidents involving serious infractions, or repeated minor infractions, will result in immediate dismissal from the summer school program without refund of tuition and with forfeiture of credit. Please note students are not allowed to smoke on campus at any time. Effective with the second offense of smoking on school grounds, students will be dismissed from the summer school program without refund of tuition and with forfeiture of credit.

### Cancelled / Full Classes

The administration reserves the right to cancel any class due to lack of enrollment. In such a case, tuition will be refunded. Also, once the registration for a class reaches its maximum, no more students will be admitted to the course. Students will be admitted to classes on a first come, first served basis.

### Supplies

**Students are required to bring materials necessary for their class (pens, pencils, notebooks, etc...). We would also encourage students to also bring other personal supplies they may need (i.e. tissues, etc...)**

### Parking

Students arriving in cars are asked to drive cautiously on school grounds, and to park in the lot between the high school and the football field. All bicycles must be placed in the bicycle rack near the aforementioned parking lot and safely locked. The school will not be responsible for lost or damaged bikes.

### Transportation

Transportation is the responsibility of the parent and student that has enrolled in the program. Students must be picked up within 15 minutes of their session dismissal. Students are only permitted in the school building for the sessions in which they are assigned. Please do not report early to class or remain after class. Remember the school is not responsible for any transportation.

### Credits

It is the responsibility of the student and/or parent to ensure that the regular school will accept the credits from our program.

## Attendance

1. **The Glassboro High Summer School will be in session from July 5, 2011 through August 3, 2011. The policies governing summer school attendance follow the rules and regulations of the State Department of Education (6:25 – 3,1). For students to be eligible for 5 credits they must be in attendance a total of 3600 minutes (60 hours). Courses worth amounts other than 5 credits will be prorated.**
2. **Additionally, the policy of the Glassboro Board of Education requires that students who do not attend classes regularly shall not receive credit nor refund of tuition. Any student who has more than 2 absences from a course through any combination of lateness and absence, *for any reason*, will not receive credit or refund of tuition. Note that a *lateness of 10 or more minutes to a class is considered an absence and leaving early 10 minutes or more is considered an absence. Lateness less than 10 minutes will result in a detention* .**
3. **Regular attendance is required. No absence or lateness is considered excused. *If a situation arises causing a student to acquire more than 2 absences, then that student does not receive credit nor refund of tuition.* There will be no exceptions to this strict attendance policy.**
4. **All students enrolled in a full session must attend not less than 20 out of the 22 days. *No vacations are permitted or excused.***
5. **Cutting class will result in immediate dismissal without refund.**
6. **Any combination of lateness and/or absences, exceeding 2 days will result in dismissal without refund.**

## Directions to GHS

Via 295: Take 295 South and exit onto Route 42 South. Take 42 South for 1.4 miles and exit onto Route 55 South (Deptford, Glassboro, Vineland). Stay on 55 South for 9.6 miles, and then take exit 50 A onto Route 322 East (Glassboro). Take Route 322 to Bowe Blvd.

Via Route 47 Delsea Drive: Coming from Woodbury area towards Glassboro, make a right on Heston Road (past College Town Shopping Center). Heston turns into Bowe Boulevard. School is on right.
